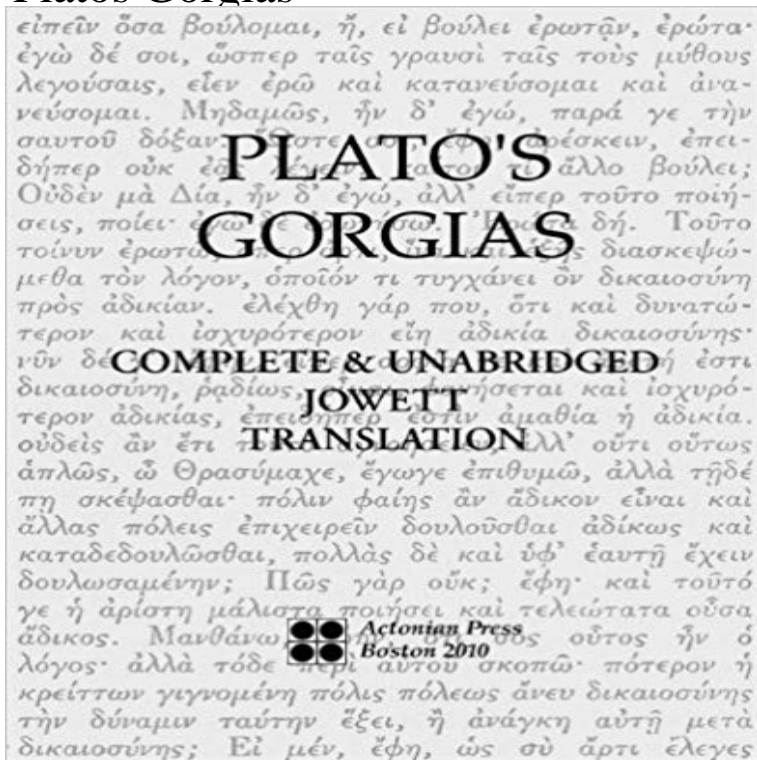


Platos Gorgias
