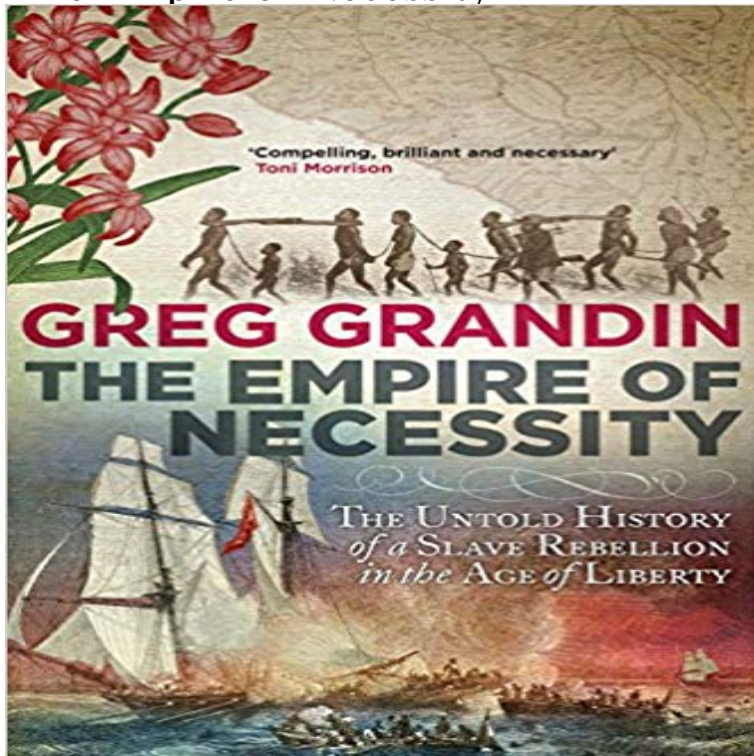


The Empire of Necessity
