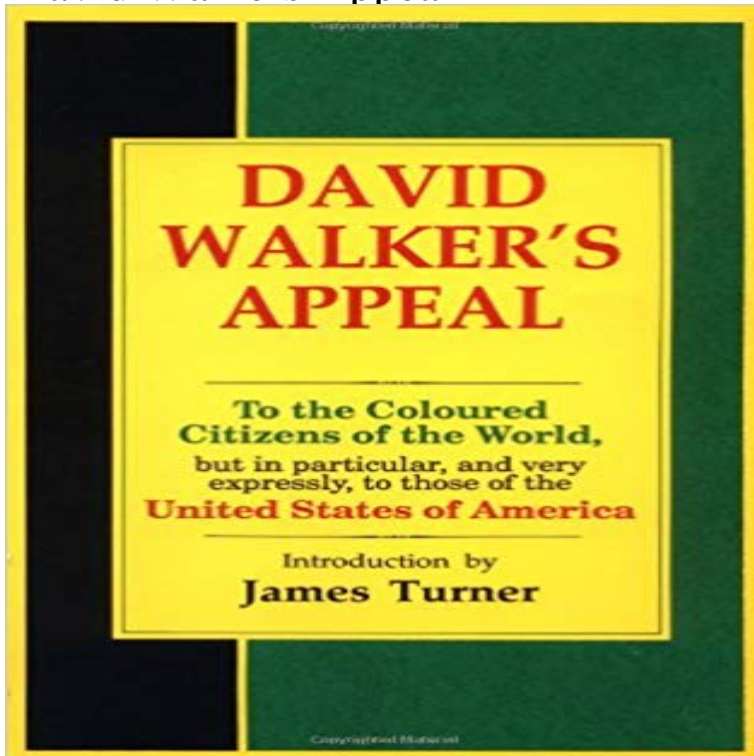


David Walkers Appeal
