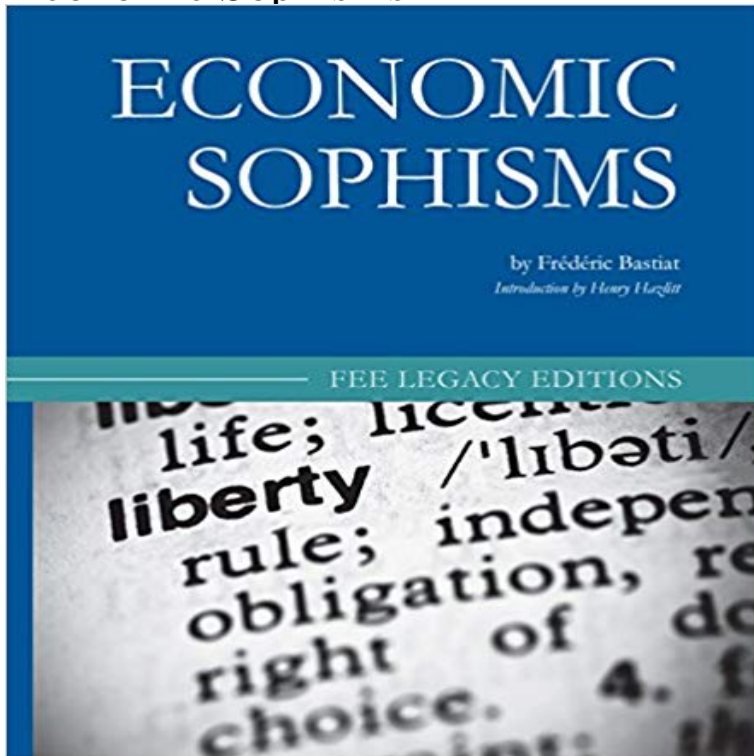


## Economic Sophisms
