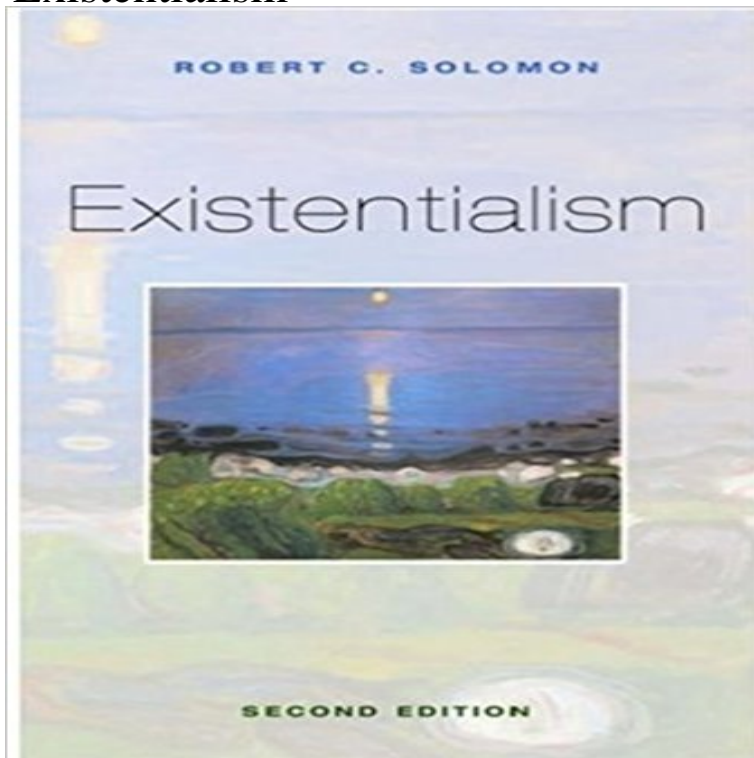


Existentialism
