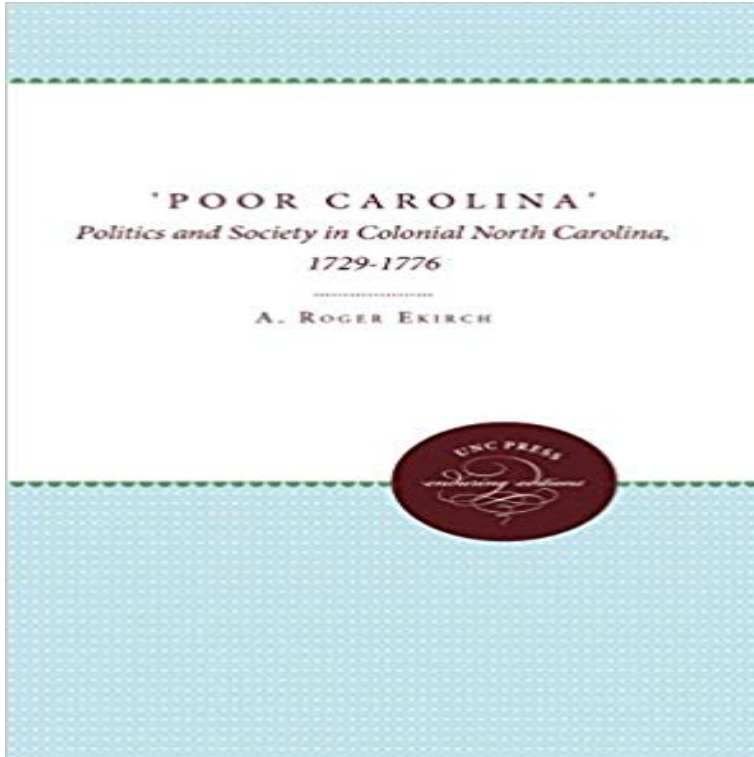


# Poor Carolina: Politics and Society in Colonial North Carolina, 1729-1776
