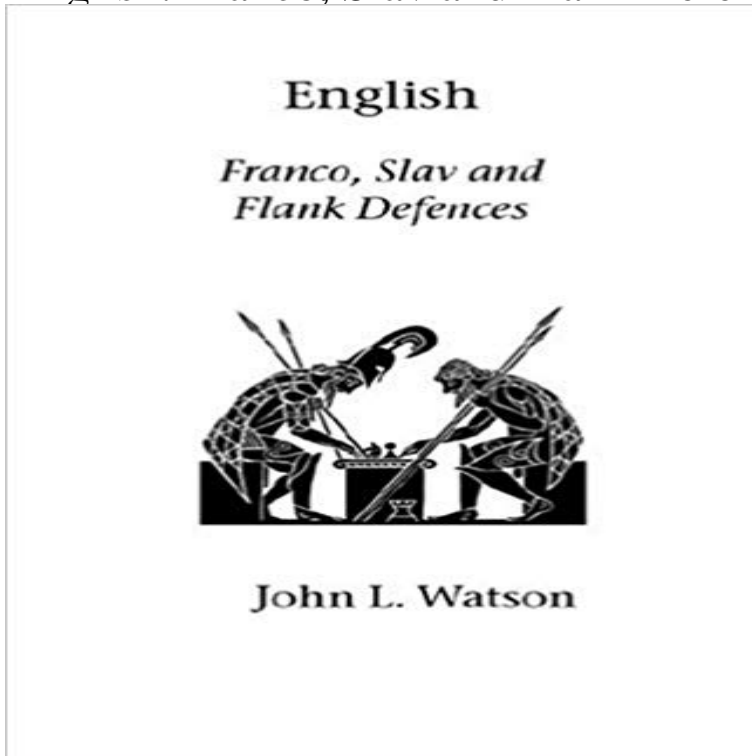


## English: Franco, Slav and Flank Defences

Black also has the choice of a number of moves that can transpose into a standard Queens Pawn (1.d4) or Kings Pawn (1.e4) opening. This book shows that White can go his own way instead and create fascinating play in which both sides have their chances. Watson's aim throughout has been to provide a practical balance of theory, discussion and examples. With encyclopaedic coverage and many original suggestions, this series gives the reader the ability to understand the complexities of the English Opening and to play it with confidence.
