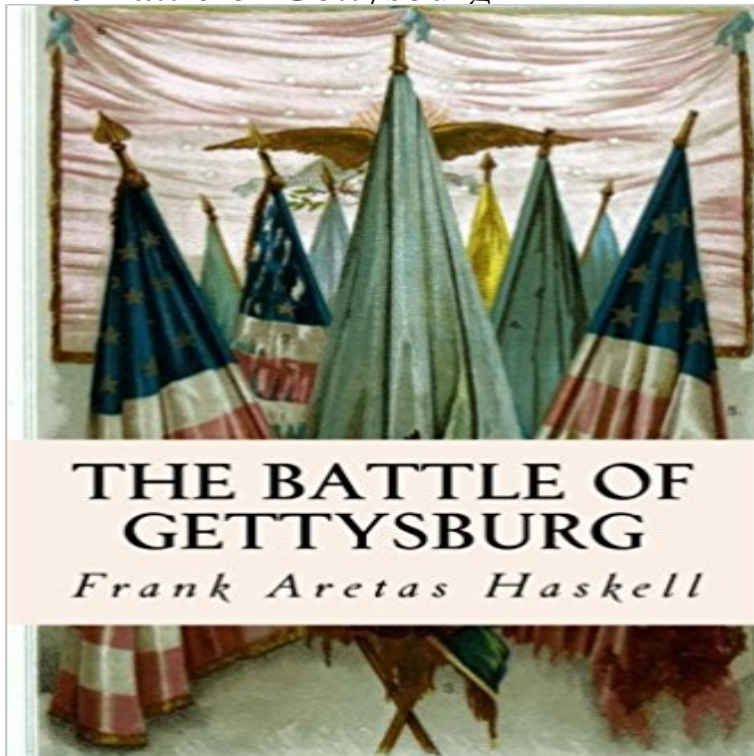


The Battle of Gettysburg
