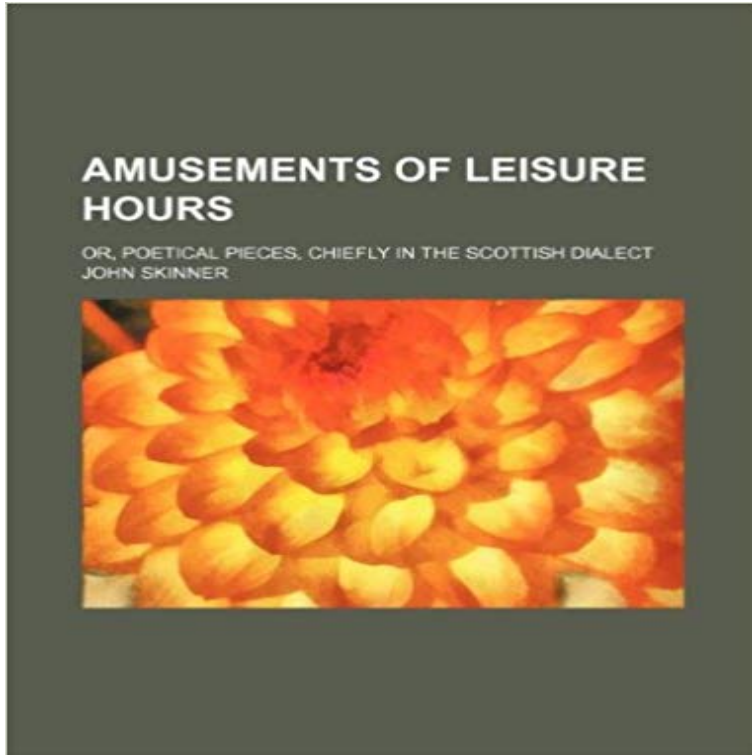


Amusements of leisure hours; or, Poetical pieces, chiefly in the Scottish dialect
