
Philosophical Remarks



When in May 1930, the Council of Trinity College, Cambridge, had to decide whether to renew Wittgensteins research grant, it turned to Bertrand Russell for an assessment of the work Wittgenstein had been doing over the past year. His verdict: The theories contained in this new work are novel, very original and indubitably important. Whether they are true, I do not know. As a logician who likes simplicity, I should like to think that they are not, but from what I have read of them I am quite sure that he ought to have an opportunity to work them out, since, when completed, they may easily prove to constitute a whole new philosophy.[Philosophical Remarks] contains the seeds of Wittgensteins later philosophy of mind and of mathematics.
