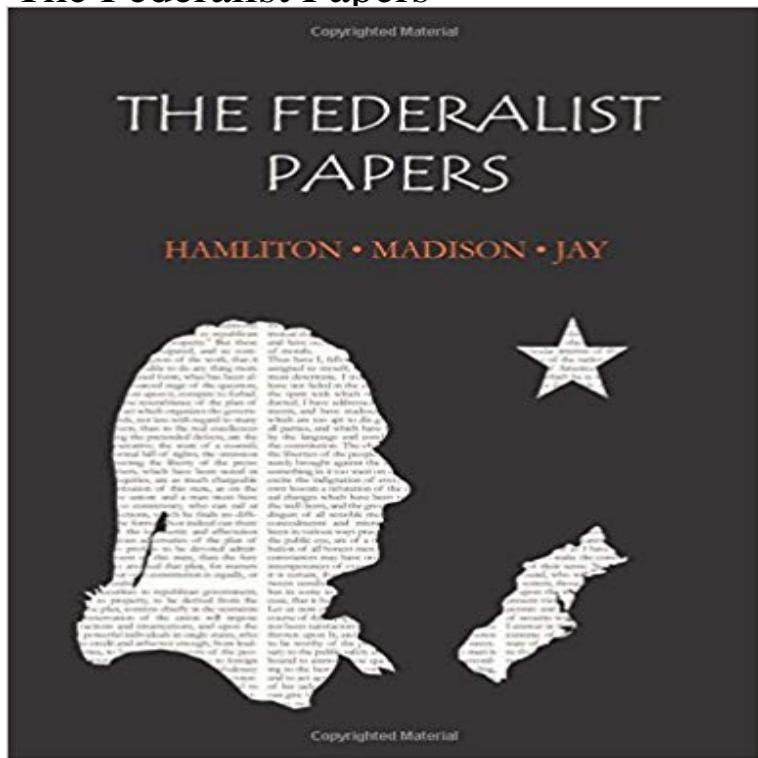


The Federalist Papers

The Federalist Papers are a collection of 85 articles published under the pseudonym Publius during the years 1787 and 1788. They were written by three of the Constitutions framers and ratifiers, Alexander Hamilton, John Jay and James Madison, to promote the ratification of the United States Constitution. Milestones in political history and philosophy, the Federalist Papers are essential reading for students, lawyers, politicians, and those with an interest in the history of human rights and the foundation of the United States of America.
