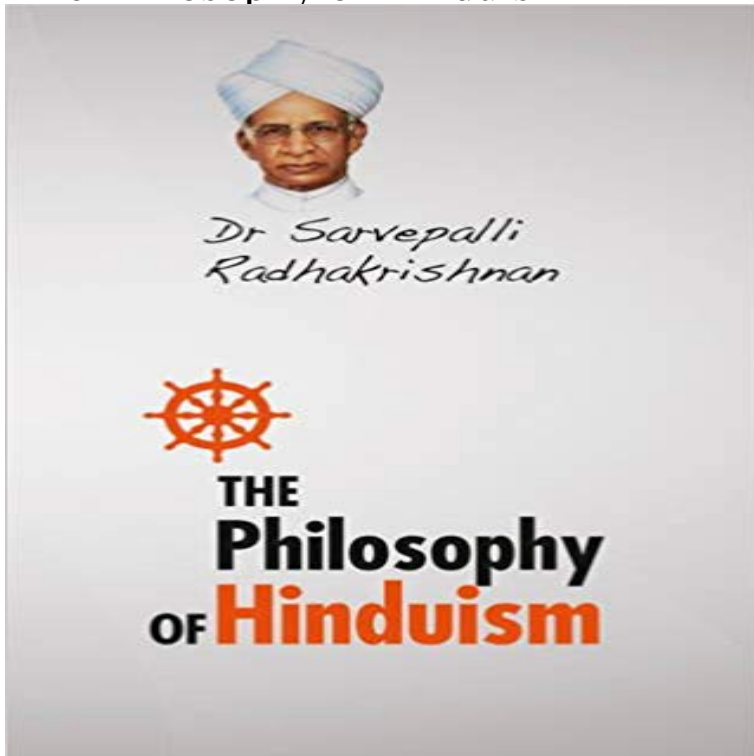


The Philosophy of Hinduism
