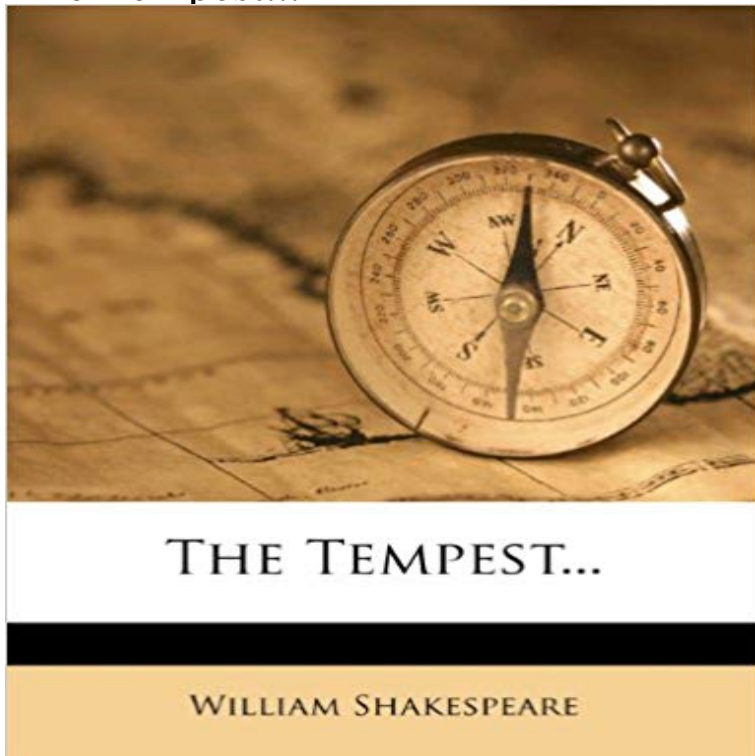


# The Tempest...
