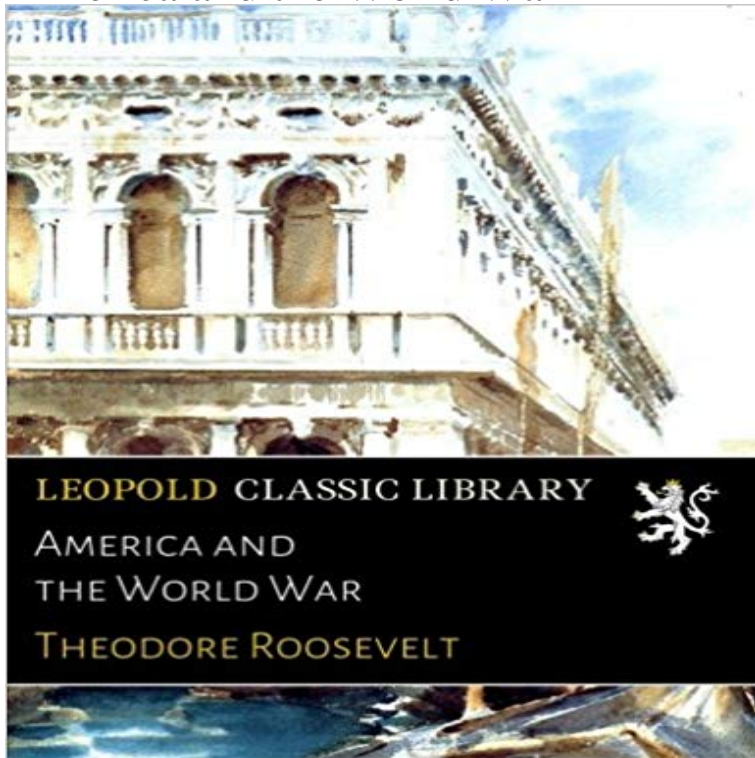


America and the World War
